

4. All documents, articles, data compilations and other material on which a generic liability expert relied in formulating his or her opinion shall be produced no later than ten (10) days in advance of a generic expert's deposition.

5. Depositions of generic liability experts shall be limited to fourteen (14) hours.

6. Daubert motions pertaining to generic liability expert testimony may be filed no later than thirty (30) days after all generic liability expert depositions have been completed. Oppositions to Daubert motions pertaining to generic liability expert testimony are due thirty (30) days after such motions have been filed. Reply briefs are due fifteen (15) days after the oppositions have been filed.

7. A new schedule for the designation and discovery of generic damage experts shall be established, if necessary, following the court's decision on the continued viability of the UDAP class in light of the recent 8th Circuit opinion.
