ORDER

On March 8, 2013, the Court denied Defendant Advantech Corporation's Motion to Vacate Entry of Default (Civil No. 11-3000 (DWF/SER), Doc. No. 90), for the reasons stated on the record. (Civil No. 11-3000 (DWF/SER), Doc. No. 103.) On March 21, 2013, the parties participated in a phone conference with the Court to discuss how to proceed on the issue of damages going forward. During the phone conference, the parties were unable to agree. In light of the Court's denial of the motion to vacate, and the

parties' disagreement regarding how to proceed on the issue of damages, the Court hereby enters to following:

ORDER

1. The parties are directed to contact Magistrate Judge Steven E. Rau's chambers to set up a settlement conference on the issue of damages in this matter.
2. Should the matter remain unresolved after the settlement conference, the Court will reach the issue of what, if any, discovery is necessary, and how to proceed with any ordered discovery, as well as the scope of the evidentiary hearing.
3. The Court reserves the right to order costs and expenses incurred with respect to the settlement conference, should such an order be warranted.
