Reappointment of Magistrate Judge Jon T. Huseby

BEMIDJI, MN – Chief Judge John R. Tunheim is pleased to announce the re-appointment of part-time Magistrate Judge Jon T. Huseby to the United States District Court, District of Minnesota.

Judge Huseby took his initial oath of office on February 25, 2015 and was re-appointed to another four-year term on November 21, 2018.

Chief Judge John R. Tunheim had the following statement, “I am delighted the merit selection panel recommended Judge Huseby for another four-year term and I look forward to his continued dedicated and service to our court, as well as to the residents of greater Minnesota.”

Judge Huseby graduated from the University of North Dakota School of Law in 2001, after earning a B.A. from the University of Minnesota and attending the Norwegian University of Science and Technology in Trondheim, Norway. Before attending school, Judge Huseby served in the U.S. Army. After law school, Judge Huseby moved to the Bemidji area, where he worked as an associate attorney at Hazelton and Rodgers from 2001 to 2006, and as a staff attorney for the Legal Services of Northwestern Minnesota from 2006-2008. Since 2008, Judge Huseby has worked at the firm of Fuller, Wallner, Cayko, Pederson & Huseby in Bemidji, where he is partner, specializing in the areas of worker’s compensation, social security disability appeals, and personal injury.

Part-Time U.S. Magistrate Judges are appointed by the U.S. District Court for a four-year term and are eligible for reappointment to successive terms. The Part-Time Magistrate Judge position serves the U.S. District Court, District of Minnesota in the Bemidji area. The primary duties performed by the Part-Time U.S. Magistrate Judge include reviewing and issuing warrants, presiding over initial appearance proceedings, and presiding over petty offense and misdemeanor proceedings.

Judge Huseby’s chambers will remain in Bemidji, where he has been chambered since 2015.
