
Pursuant to LR83.9, Local Rules, United States District Court for the District of Minnesota, the rules of this Court are supplemented by adding the following:


IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that a processing fee of \$25.00 as indicated on the new violation notice form will be assessed to each defendant who forfeits collateral, or is convicted, on each violation notice processed through the Central Violations Bureau (CVB). This fee will be applied to all forfeiture of collateral schedules filed in the District of Minnesota.


IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that a Special Assessment shall be assessed per count on any person convicted of an offense in the amount of \$10.00 in the case of class B misdemeanor or in the amount of \$5.00 in the case of an infraction or a class C misdemeanor.


