
Plaintiffs have submitted a report on the request of Canadian class action plaintiffs for coordination between the MDL and the pending Canadian class actions. Specifically,

The Court will not entertain the request at this time as it is not properly before the Court. Many courts have held that in order to seek modification of a protective order, a third-party must first obtain intervenor status. Griffith v. University Hosp. Applied Extrusion Technologies, Inc., 998 F.2d 157 (3td Cir. 1993); Beckman Indus., Inc. v. International Ins. Co., 966 F.2d 470 (9th Cir.), cert. denied, 506 U.S. 868 (1992); United Nuclear Corp. v. Cranford Ins. Co., 905 F.2d 1424, 1427 (10th Cir. 1990), cert. denied, 498 U.S. 1073 (1991); Public Citizen v. Liggett Group, Inc., 858 F.2d 775, 783-784 (1st Cir. 1988), cert. denied, 438 U.S. 1030 (1989); Meyer Goldberg, Inc. v. Fisher Foods, 823 F.2d 159, 162 (6th Cir.1987); Martindell v. International Tel. & Tel. Corp., 594 F.2d 291, 294 (2nd Cir. 1979); In re



Beef Indus. Antitrust Litigation, 589 F.2d 786, 789 (5th Cir. 1979).

Accordingly, until a proper motion for intervention is before this Court, the Canadian class action plaintiffs' request for access to discovery obtained in this case is DENIED.
