As required by law, the United States District Court, District of Minnesota will establish a Merit Selection Panel of citizens to consider the reappointment of Part-Time Magistrate Judge Jon T. Huseby to a new four-year term. The Court will publicly announce the Merit Selection Panel members at a later date.

The duties of Magistrate Judges are enumerated in 28 U.S.C. § 636 and Local Rule 72.1. The duties of a part-time magistrate judge generally include presiding over initial proceedings in criminal cases; trials of misdemeanor cases, including petty offenses; and pretrial matters and other proceedings in criminal cases. Part-time Magistrate Judges are appointed by the United States District Court for four-year terms and may be reappointed to successive terms.
