United States District Court, District of Minnesota Reappointment of Magistrate Judge David T. Schultz

MINNEAPOLIS, MN – Chief Judge Patrick J. Schiltz is pleased to announce the re-appointment of Magistrate Judge David T. Schultz to the United States District Court for the District of Minnesota.

Magistrate Judge Schultz took his initial oath of office on February 7, 2017, and will be reappointed to another eight-year term effective February 7, 2025.

Chief Judge Schiltz had the following statement: "Judge Schultz has been a terrific magistrate judge, and he has been particularly adept at managing and settling complex civil cases. Members of the legal community have nothing but praise for his work. We are grateful that he is willing to serve another term."

Magistrate Judge Schultz received his Bachelor's degree in Political Science from Carleton College in Northfield, Minnesota. After spending a year playing semi-professional baseball and working in a Chicago law firm, he attended Stanford University Law School. After law school, Judge Schultz returned to Minnesota and began a vibrant civil trial and appellate practice as an Assistant Attorney General, where he defended state agencies, constitutional officers, and judges in all manner of civil litigation. After 11 years at the Minnesota Attorney General's Office, Judge Schultz spent the next 20 years in private practice – first with the firm Halleland Lewis Nilan and with then Maslon, LLP.

Judge Schultz will continue to be chambered in the Diana E. Murphy U.S. Courthouse in Minneapolis.
