ORDER

The United States of America, by and through Erica H. MacDonald, United States Attorney for the District of Minnesota, Colin W. Trundle, Student Attorney, and Samantha H. Bates, Assistant United States Attorney, move the Court to adopt a Forfeiture of Collateral Schedule for postal statutes and regulations.


IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the attached Forfeiture of Collateral Schedule be adopted and that any person charged with violating a petty offense listed in the attached Forfeiture of Collateral Schedule may, in lieu of appearance, post collateral in the amount indicated for the offense and consent to forfeiture of collateral or be required to appear in court. Any such person shall also pay a processing fee determined by the Central Violations Bureau of the U.S. Courts.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that collateral for misdemeanor violations of Minnesota law on postal property that are assimilated under Title 18, U.S. Code, Section 13 shall consist of a processing fee determined by the Central Violations Bureau of the U.S. Courts and the fine amount listed in the Minnesota statewide payables list authorized by Minnesota Statute 609.101 and approved by the Judicial Council for the State of Minnesota for the particular offense.

This order does not restrict law enforcement from compelling the mandatory appearance of the accused before the Court in lieu of posting collateral or from effecting an arrest pursuant to Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure, Rule 5.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this order will take effect at 12:01 a.m.

on June 30, 2020.






