The classifications are listed in alphabetical order under rate identifiers indicating whether the particular rate is a union rate (current union negotiated rate), a survey rate, a weighted union average rate, a state adopted rate, or a supplemental classification rate.

#### Union Rate Identifiers

A four-letter identifier beginning with characters other than ""SU"", ""UAVG"", ?SA?, or ?SC? denotes that a union rate was prevailing for that classification in the survey. Example: PLUM0198-005 07/01/2024. PLUM is an identifier of the union whose collectively bargained rate prevailed in the survey for this classification, which in this example would be Plumbers. 0198 indicates the local union number or district council number where applicable, i.e., Plumbers Local 0198. The next number, 005 in the example, is an internal number used in processing the wage determination. The date, 07/01/2024 in the example, is the effective date of the most current negotiated rate.

Union prevailing wage rates are updated to reflect all changes over time that are reported to WHD in the rates in the collective bargaining agreement (CBA) governing the classification.

#### Union Average Rate Identifiers

The UAVG identifier indicates that no single rate prevailed for those classifications, but that 100% of the data reported for the classifications reflected union rates. EXAMPLE: UAVG-OH-0010 01/01/2024. UAVG indicates that the rate is a weighted union average rate. OH indicates the State of Ohio. The next number, 0010 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. The date, 01/01/2024 in the example, indicates the date the wage determination was updated to reflect the most current union average rate.

A UAVG rate will be updated once a year, usually in January, to reflect a weighted average of the current rates in the collective bargaining agreements on which the rate is based.

#### Survey Rate Identifiers

The ""SU"" identifier indicates that either a single non-union

rate prevailed (as defined in 29 CFR 1.2) for this classification in the survey or that the rate was derived by computing a weighted average rate based on all the rates reported in the survey for that classification. As a weighted average rate includes all rates reported in the survey, it may include both union and non-union rates. Example: SUFL2022-007 6/27/2024. SU indicates the rate is a single non-union prevailing rate or a weighted average of survey data for that classification. FL indicates the State of Florida. 2022 is the year of the survey on which these classifications and rates are based. The next number, 007 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. The date, 6/27/2024 in the example, indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

?SU? wage rates typically remain in effect until a new survey is conducted. However, the Wage and Hour Division (WHD) has the discretion to update such rates under 29 CFR 1.6(c)(1).

#### State Adopted Rate Identifiers

The ""SA"" identifier indicates that the classifications and prevailing wage rates set by a state (or local) government were adopted under 29 C.F.R 1.3(g)-(h). Example: SAME2023-007 01/03/2024. SA reflects that the rates are state adopted. ME refers to the State of Maine. 2023 is the year during which the state completed the survey on which the listed classifications and rates are based. The next number, 007 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. The date, 01/03/2024 in the example, reflects the date on which the classifications and rates under the ?SA? identifier took effect under state law in the state from which the rates were adopted.

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#### WAGE DETERMINATION APPEALS PROCESS

1) Has there been an initial decision in the matter? This can be:

- a) a survey underlying a wage determination
- b) an existing published wage determination
- c) an initial WHD letter setting forth a position on a wage determination matter
- d) an initial conformance (additional classification and rate) determination

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## SCOPE OF WORK ATTACHMENT FOR RFQ #MNXDCLERK26-0006

This document serves to describe the scope of work required for Courtroom 9W audio/video and network wire removal and pull projects.

The Contractor will perform the following activities in the courtroom:

1. Remove cabling in Walkerduct system that is being replaced, to make space for new cable. The Court will be responsible for having the carpet pulled back so the primary Walkerduct panels are accessible, and at the upper and lower bench areas where access panels exist for cabling. The Contractor will be responsible for removing the primary Walkerduct panels and access panels for access to the cable troughs. All removed materials must be disposed of by the Contractor off-site: use of the trash system in the Court building is not allowed. The Contractor must consult the Court as to which cables can be removed, as some cables will be reused for the Court's new A/V installations. The ceiling speakers and infrared emitters will not be rewired and the existing cables must remain in place. The Contractor is responsible for reattaching the Walkerduct panels and access panels after all cabling has been completed and tested. The Court will be responsible for having the carpet reapplied.
2. The A/V closet is a shared closet for Courtrooms 9W and 9E. **The equipment and cabling for Courtroom 9E must remain in place since it is a functional courtroom and outside the scope of this project.** All removed materials must be disposed of by the Contractor off-site: use of the trash system in the Court building is not allowed.
3. Coordinate A/V rack location, cabling routes and maintenance loops with the Court, since it is a shared A/V room.
4. All cables will be terminated and tested end to end, as described on the *Wire Pull Specs and Drawings Attachment* and terminated in the A/V rack patch panels. The A/V rack patch panels will be provided by the Contractor.
5. Remove existing plates and replace with new plates. The new plates will be provided by the Court. Any plates with blank keystone jacks must receive blank inserts. All removed materials must be disposed of by the Contractor off-site: use of the trash system in the Court building is not allowed.
6. Some of the termination locations will require surface mounted junction boxes, provided by the Contractor. The Contractor will remove existing cable management and provide cable management as needed for the new junction boxes. See attachment for type and locations.
7. Install and terminate new cabling, as described on the *Wire Pull Specs and Drawings Attachment*, using the custom Court-provided plates or contractor-provided keystone jack network coupler with pig tails, as specified in the attachments. Blank inserts will be provided by the Contractor. All cables are to be labeled on both ends with a laminated label displaying the *Cable Label* information specified on the *Wire Pull Specs and Drawings Attachment*.
8. Generate a report showing each cable is functional and correctly terminated as specified by the wiring manufacturer's instructions. All terminations must be performed by a certified specialist to maintain warranty with termination product.
9. Remedy promptly any deficiencies identified by the Court during inspection.
10. All cables pulled into the A/V closet must have a minimum excess of 10 feet of length for rack and patch panel installation as a maintenance loop. Cat6 cable is to be terminated into a patch panel installed in the A/V rack. The Contractor is to supply all cables. The Contractor is to supply and install the necessary 48 port patch panels in the A/V closet rack. The rack is to be provided by the Court.
